

ENGAGING ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEMS FOR THE YOUTH

Match-making tool

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About this report

This document is a deliverable for the Ecosys4you project as part of working package 4 "Internships," Task 4.1: "Development of the internship programme" by the Institute for Work and Technology of the Westphalian University of Applied Sciences. It presents a match-making tool for selecting start-ups and interns for the cross-ecosystem internship programme. Ecosys4you has received funding from the European Union's Horizon Europe research and innovation programme under Grant Agreement No. 101100432.

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Overview

This report briefly describes the match-making process through which the Ecosys4you interns came into contact with the startups of the Ruhr entrepreneurial ecosystem. It describes how interns and startups were enabled to make choices that matched their interests.

The first part (Match-making I) covers the phase from the application to the mutual agreement between the intern and the startup. The second part (Matchmaking II) begins with the agreement and ends with the intern's first day at the startup.

1 Match-Making I: Getting to know each other




Figure 2. Application Form

The illustration below (Figure 1) summarises the first phase of the match-making process. The journey started with the interns submitting an application in which they could indicate their sectoral interests, accompanied by a CV (Figure 2). This was an important guideline for the Ecosys4you team to be able to approach suitable start-ups. In an initial introductory meeting between the start-ups and the Ecosys4you team, the focus was on explaining the internship programme and asking whether the start-ups would be interested in being supported by an intern.

This approach resulted in a pool of start-ups that had expressed interest and were informed about the framework and duration of the programme. In the next step, start-ups were selected based on the interns' preferences, and the interns' CVs were sent to them to confirm that their competencies matched.

The interns were then contacted. They were sent links to the start-ups' websites and could choose between two start-ups or say they did not consider either suitable.

A video call was organised so the start-up and intern could get to know each other. Once both confirmed their interest in the internship by email, the first phase of the match-making process ended.

Lessons learned from phase I

Four out of six candidates were matched with a start-up. The option for declaring sectors of preference proved very useful for pre-matching the candidates with suitable start-ups. Only one candidate initially declined the preselected start-ups; however, after clarifying his area of interest and competencies, the team quickly arranged a suitable internship. This experience underscored the need for clear communication of interest and competencies from the interns and requirements from the start-ups. Furthermore, depending on the candidates' age and previous experience, it could be beneficial to provide them with clear guidelines about the structure, content and necessary format for the CV. A dedicated contact person should constantly communicate with the candidates to ensure their commitment, answer their questions or get informed if they decide to drop out of the process. Two out of six candidates in the first round retracted their application during the start-up searching process. One was due to a different job opportunity, and the other was without feedback.
